ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
2001-30


WHEREAS, changes in Criminal Rule 5.2 effective October 1, 2001 permit the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court to determine the use of audiotape and/or videotape recording systems in Preliminary Hearings, unless a court reporter is requested by a party;

IT IS ORDERED that audiotape and/or videotape shall be used for Preliminary Hearings unless a party files a written request for the use of a court reporter at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance of the time of the hearing, and on a regular court business day prior to the hearing day.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that audiotape systems used for Preliminary Hearings shall meet the minimum standard of a four channel, four track, dual tape system.

FURTHERMORE this order does not restrict or prohibit any party from independently obtaining the services of a court reporter, certified in the State of Arizona by the Board of Certified Court Reporters, at any time for use in a Preliminary Hearings.
